Food safety caused by antibiotic overuse and irregular breeding has become the focus of government and society. If the sustainability of agricultural development could not be ensured, the consequences would be disastrous. In recent years, a number of malpractices have dropped public satisfaction and confidence in country’s food safety.

[REDACTED], CPPCC member from Hainan province said that China's annual output of antibiotics reaches 200,000 tons, and nearly 10 million tons are used in feed, resulting in a large number of antibiotic residues in meat. Journalists from CCTV and researchers from State Key Lab of Water Environment Simulation, Water Research Institute from Beijing Normal University detected the surface water sampling from some regions of China and found massive antibiotic contents in the samplings. Antibiotic residues were even found in the water supplied
