Your Excellency,

We are following up on the invitation letter sent earlier in the year by the Prime Minister of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Rt Hon Boris Johnson MP, to the Global Vaccine Summit 2020.

Given the current challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic around the world, and as announced on 24th April by the Foreign Secretary of the United Kingdom, the Rt Hon Dominic Raab MP, on behalf of the Prime Minister, we are writing to inform you that the Summit will now be held entirely virtually on the afternoon (UK time) of 4th June.

The Global Vaccine Summit comes at a critical time for Gavi and for the world, as we are reminded that diseases know no borders, that international cooperation is crucial to bringing the coronavirus pandemic to an end, and the critical role vaccines play in infectious disease control.

Together, we must ensure that Gavi's programme for 2021-2025 is fully funded with at least \$7.4bn to immunise an additional 300 million children, invest further in vaccine stockpiles that protect against diseases of epidemic potential, and ensure that we do not risk losing all the hard fought gains of the past 20 years since Gavi's creation — achieving massive scale through immunising 760m children and over 1 billion people through campaigns, and saving 13 million lives in doing so. Vaccine preventable diseases have already reduced in Gavi supported countries by 70% and child mortality by 50% - but there is more to do.

This is a critical moment for global leaders and businesses to come together to discuss Gavi and the role of vaccines in preventing infectious disease, protecting people around the world, and helping communities to prosper; and to that end, pledge vital funds and support vaccination so that we can continue to protect the most vulnerable communities in the world from pandemics and outbreaks. The importance of accelerating equitable access to a future COVID-19 vaccine will also be part of the discussion.

We would be honoured for you to participate virtually, together with other global leaders, in the Global Vaccine Summit 2020.
