The Consultative Forum members do not have own verified information on the six alleged incidents. To facilitate the work of the inquiry, it has, however, reviewed publicly available sources reporting incidents which occurred at the indicated dates in the relevant geographical area and compiled this in an annex. The Consultative Forum has not verified the information reported below.

According to witness accounts, after about 1 ½ hours of moving, the people suddenly found themselves confronted with a big grey boat with a blue-white line. The boat had reportedly a Greek flag and many officers on board. Alarm Phone was alerted to this group of people after they had been pushed back to Turkish waters. Unable to move by themselves in a boat with water leaking in, the people were desperately asking for rescue. At 12:36h CEST, we informed the Greek coastguard about the boat in distress and were told that it was in Turkish waters and a Turkish coastguard vessel was nearby"
