In response to your application of 20 January 2018 which has been registered on 22 January 2018 - asking for access to:

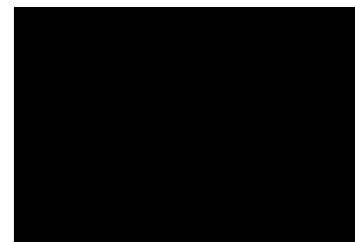
- EU Justice and Home Affairs Agencies' cooperation in 2017 - Final report

I am pleased to inform you that Frontex agrees to grant you access. You may find the documents attached. Please be informed that the Final report on EU Justice and Home Affairs Agencies' cooperation in 2017 includes the Multilateral JHA Agencies Scorecard 2017.

Please note however that after having consulted the relevant third party pursuant to Article 4(4) of Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001 of 30 May 2001 it has been assessed that some limited parts of the documents you have applied for fall under an exception to public access to documents as stipulated in the aforementioned Regulation and have therefore been blanked out. The non-disclosed text contains information intended for internal communication and documentation of work in progress of the third party. In this light, the disclosure of such information would undermine the third party decision-making process in the sense of Article 4(3) of Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001. The non-disclosed text contains as well personal data, in particular the names of individuals. Its disclosure would affect the privacy and integrity of the individuals. Therefore, its disclosure is precluded pursuant to the exception laid down in Article 4(1)(b) of Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001.

Kindly be reminded that the copyright of the documents rests with Frontex and that the existing rules on copyright may limit your right to reproduce or exploit the released documents.
